Direct Exposure to someone Positive for COVID -19

COVID SYMPTOMS

- Fever greater than or equal to 100.0
- Cough
- Loss of Taste or Smell
- Shortness of Breath
- Difficulty Breathing
- Fatigue
- Headache
- Chills
- Sore Throat
- Congestion or Runny Nose
- Shaking or Exaggerated Shivering
- Significant Muscle or Body Aches
- Nausea or Vomiting
- Diarrhea

DIRECT EXPOSURE MEANS:

An individual being within 3 feet for longer than 15 minutes of someone who is positive for COVID-19.

However, additional factors like case/contact masking (i.e., both the infectious individual and the potential close contact have been consistently and properly masked), ventilation, presence of dividers, vaccination status, prior infection status, and case of symptomology may affect this determination.

Person living in the home is Positive for COVID-19

Student or Staff Member that is notified as having been in close contact to person positive with COVID-19 outside the home.

Student will stay home 14 days

Parent or staff member will make determination as to whether they will need to isolate at home according to CDC guidelines.

Student can return to school on Day 15, and if never developed COVID-19 symptoms.

Student or Staff member should continue to monitor for any development of COVID-19 related symptoms. Students and staff should never attend school if having any COVID-19 symptoms.

Fully vaccinated students and staff members are not considered close contacts and can continue to attend school. However, its recommended to monitor for any development of COVID-19 symptoms, and be periodically tested when exposed. Staff members exposed at home will undergo periodic covid testing if they are still coming to work.
