

TITLE I PARENT NOTIFICATION

Each parent of a student attending a Title I funded campus has the right to certain information regarding the supplemental federal funding, the services offered, and the program requirements of that school. This document will serve as the parent notification as required by Public Law 107-110 Section 1118.

Written Parent and Family Involvement Policy

- Each Title I campus must distribute a written parent and family engagement policy. This policy should be developed jointly with and agreed upon by parents at the participating Title I school. This policy is the campus's plan to more actively involve parents in their child's education. As a campus we welcome your participation in your child's activities at school. Your participation can range from volunteering in the classroom to chairing a committee at the school. Any and all parent involvement is welcome.

School-Parent Compact

- Each Title I campus must distribute to each parent a School-Parent Compact. This is a voluntary agreement between the home and the school which defines the goals, expectations, and shared responsibilities of the school, parents, and students as equal partners in student learning.

Parent's Notification

- Each Title I campus is required to notify parents of their right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of his/her child's classroom teacher.
- Each Title I campus is required to provide each individual parent with information on the parent's right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of his/her child's classroom teacher.
- The school district is required to notify parents on the level of achievement of their child on the required state academic assessments.
- The school district is required to notify parents in a timely manner if their child has been taught for four consecutive weeks by a teacher who was not highly qualified.
- The school district is required to notify parents in a timely manner if their child's campus has been determined to be in need of school improvement. If the campus receives this designation, it must notify parents of school choice options and supplemental educational services. The school is also required to notify parents initially and then follow up with a second notification of the campus being in need of school improvement.
- Each Title I campus is required to notify parents of the district and campus level attendance in state required training for Supplemental Educational Services, if applicable.

Annual Meeting

- Each Title I campus must convene an annual meeting to notify parents of the school's participation in the Title I program, the requirements of the program, and the parents' rights to be involved in their child's education.
- Each Title I campus must educate teachers, pupil services personnel, principals, and other staff members in the value and utility of the contributions of parents.
